EXCUSE MY BEHAVIOR... INTRODUCTION TO APPLIED BEHAVIOUR ANALYSIS

9-11AM

Do you want to learn more about Applied Behaviour Analysis (ABA) and how it can benefit your life? This seminar will teach caregivers about the science of ABA. Topics discussed include motivation, reinforcement, data collection, and the application of ABA strategies. Families will learn how to use these skills in various environments and across different situations.

COMMUNICATION TANGO: CREATING & BUILDING COMMUNICATION OPPORTUNITIES

Communication is a complex system of sending and receiving information. This seminar focuses on understanding the whole body as a communication tool and how we send and receive information. Participants will be taught the foundational starting points of capturing motivation, understanding their child's nonverbal communication and effectively responding to their child's communication. Additional focus will include the different intentions behind your child's communication and how you can create an environment that increases the opportunity for communication.



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CHALLENGING BEHAVIOUR 101: PLAYING DETECTIVE

Do you ever wonder why your child engages in challenging behaviour? Unsure where to start in dealing with challenging behaviour? This seminar focuses on the functions: why individuals engage in challenging behaviours, what function is creating these behaviours, and how to collect valuable data. It also includes a brief introduction to preventative strategies that can be utilized before your child engages in challenging behaviour to decrease the chances of that happening.

CHALLENGING BEHAVIOUR 102: STEPS TO POSITIVE CHANGE

You've figured out why your child engages in challenging behaviour, now what? Are you unsure of where to go next, now that you've tried the strategies shared in 'Playing Detective'? This seminar goes more in depth with strategies that can be used to decrease challenging behaviours observed at home, and introduces what to do if your child does engage in these behaviour

BEHAVIOURAL CONSULTATION SESSIONS

Supervised by a Board Certified Behaviour Analyst, Autism Consultations provide behavioural support to: answer your questions regarding behavior change and behavioural services; address any concerns you may have; and provide family supports and resources. Consultations last 45 minutes and families will be provided with a summary of the session.

In your 45-minute consultation, you will receive information about the Ontario Autism Program and service providers and resources available in your community.
